

115年臺英大學聯盟
Taiwan-UK University Consortium (TUKUC)
教育部補助計畫徵件簡章

為促進臺灣與英國在學術及英語教學領域的合作，臺灣教育部與英國文化協會（British Council）攜手成立臺英大學聯盟（Taiwan-UK University Consortium, TUKUC）。聯盟匯聚臺灣與英國各四所頂尖高等教育機構，以跨學科及跨文化的視角，共同應對全球關鍵挑戰，推動學術與教育的深度合作。聯盟盟校為愛丁堡大學（University of Edinburgh）、西蘇格蘭大學（University of the West of Scotland）、新堡大學（Newcastle University）、利物浦大學（University of Liverpool）、國立臺灣大學、國立臺灣師範大學、國立清華大學及國立中山大學。

為實現上述合作目標，教育部將透過補助學術合作計畫，進一步深化臺英雙方的交流與連結。本補助經費分成兩大項目：研究計畫及國際移動交流。

壹、計畫期程：自計畫核定日起至115年12月31日止。

貳、實施對象：臺英大學聯盟臺灣會員校專任教學研究人員及在學學生為限。

參、辦理方式：

一、研究計畫

(一) 徵件主題如下：

1. 綠色能源與淨零解決方案（Green Energy and Net Zero Solutions）
2. 英語作為教學與學習語言（English as the language of Teaching and Learning）

(二) 申請資格：以臺英大學聯盟臺灣會員校之專任教學研究人員為限，
每件計畫應由至少1所TUKUC臺灣學校成員，以及至少1所TUKUC
英國學校參與。

(三) 補助計畫數與經費額度：每校250萬新臺幣。

1. 綠色能源與淨零解決方案

2. 英語作為教學與學習語言（每校至多補助新臺幣100萬）

(四) 計畫須依附件範本格式（附件1）提出，以英文書寫。另請各計畫主
持人填具「支領教育部及所屬機關補（捐）助及委辦計畫兼任計畫
主持人費明細表」（附件2）。

二、國際移動交流

(一) 交流領域：鼓勵聯盟教師互訪及本國學生赴英國學習，不限領域，
但以下列主題為優先考量：

1. 綠色能源與淨零解決方案（Green Energy and Net Zero Solutions）
2. 英語作為教學與學習語言（English as the language of Teaching and
Learning）

(二) 申請資格：臺英大學聯盟臺灣會員校之專任教學研究人員及在學臺
籍學生為限。

(三) 補助計畫數與經費額度：本交流補助案以促進臺英盟校之間實質交
流合作為目的，補助人數、停留時間及金額可視實際執行情況規劃，
每校補助131萬元。

1.教師短期訪問：

(1) 學術出訪：聯盟擬鼓勵臺灣教師赴英國盟校進行研究及教學交流訪問，以增進彼此的瞭解。

(2) 學術邀訪：邀請英國盟校學者來臺進行短期研究或教學，補助經濟艙機票及在臺生活費。

2.臺灣學生出國研習：

(1) 短期研習：為鼓勵更多臺灣學生赴英國盟校交流學習，本計畫擬獎助臺灣四校學生參與短期計畫，包含交換學生及短期研究、學習。

肆、計畫及經費審查：本校將邀請計畫審查委員審查各校所提之計畫及經費，實際補助金額將視計畫審查結果核定。

伍、經費核撥及結報：各校應檢具相關收據向本校辦理撥款事宜，各項經費使用應依據教育部各相關辦法辦理核銷。各校並應於115年12月31日前完成校內核銷，並於116年1月31日前繳交結案報告給本校。未核銷完畢之經費將全數繳回本校，以便本校彙整繳回及函報教育部核結。結案所需資料將另行公布。

2026 Taiwan-UK University Consortium (TUKUC)
Ministry of Education Grant: Call for Proposals

To promote academic and English language collaboration between Taiwan and the UK, the Taiwan Ministry of Education (MOE) and the British Council have jointly established the Taiwan-UK University Consortium (TUKUC). This consortium brings together four leading higher education institutions from each country, fostering interdisciplinary and cross-cultural perspectives to address global challenges and advance academic and educational cooperation. Member universities include the University of Edinburgh, the University of the West of Scotland, Newcastle University, the University of Liverpool, National Taiwan University, National Taiwan Normal University, National Tsing Hua University, and National Sun Yat-sen University.

To achieve these goals, the MOE will provide funding for academic collaboration projects to further enhance exchanges and connections between Taiwan and the UK. The funding is divided into two main categories: Research Projects and International Mobility Programs.

1. Project Period

From the date of project approval to December 31, 2026.

2. Eligibility

Applications are open exclusively to full-time faculty members and currently enrolled students of Taiwan TUKUC member institutions.

3. Funding Categories

3-1 Research Projects

3-1-1 Call for Proposals

Proposals should align with one of the following themes:

- Green Energy and Net Zero Solutions
- English as the Language of Teaching and Learning

3-1-2 Applicant Eligibility

Applicants must be full-time and certified faculty members or researchers from Taiwan TUKUC member universities. Each project must involve participation

from at least one TUKUC member institution from both Taiwan and the UK.

3-1-3 Funding Allocation

Each of the four Taiwan TUKUC member universities will receive support of up to NT\$ 2,500,000.

- Green Energy and Net Zero Solutions
- English as the Language of Teaching and Learning (Up to NT\$1,000,000 per institution)

3-1-4 Application Submission

Proposals must be prepared in English using the designated format (Appendix 1). In addition, each Principal Investigator is required to complete the “Statement of Remuneration for Concurrent Principal Investigator Positions under Grants (Donations) and Commissioned Projects Funded by the Ministry of Education and its Affiliated Agencies” (Appendix 2).

Each member university must compile and prioritize applications before submitting them. The prioritized proposal list (Appendix 3), along with all proposal documents, should be emailed to erica@g-mail.nsysu.edu.tw by March 2, 2026 (Monday) for review.

3-2 International Mobility Programs

3-2-1 Mobility Opportunities

This program supports faculty and student mobility between Taiwan and the United Kingdom to strengthen academic exchange and institutional collaboration. While proposals from all academic disciplines are welcome, priority consideration will be given to projects aligned with the following thematic areas:

- Green Energy and Net Zero Solutions
- English as the Language of Teaching and Learning

3-2-2 Applicant Eligibility

Applications are open to full-time faculty members and currently enrolled students of Taiwanese nationality at Taiwanese member universities.

3-2-3 Funding Allocation

The number of funded participants, duration of mobility, and funding amounts may be adjusted based on actual implementation needs. Each participating university may receive funding of up to NT\$1,310,000.

A. Short-Term Faculty Visits

Funding categories:

a. Taiwan scholars to the UK

This category supports faculty members from Taiwan in conducting short-term visits to UK partner universities for research and teaching exchanges, with the aim of strengthening bilateral academic collaboration.

d. UK Scholars to Taiwan

Under this category, Taiwanese institutions may invite faculty members from UK partner universities to Taiwan for short-term research or teaching activities. Funding support includes economy-class airfare and living expenses for the duration of the visit in Taiwan.

B. Student Mobility Grants

a. Short-Term Study Abroad Programs

To encourage greater student mobility, this category provides funding support for students of Taiwanese nationality to participate in short-term academic programs at UK partner universities. Eligible activities include exchange programs, short-term study, short-term research placements, etc.

3-2-4 Application Submission

Applications shall be collected twice per month by the designated contact persons of each member university (Appendix 4: Faculty Application Form; Appendix 5: Student Application Form) and submitted in electronic format to tukuc@g-mail.nsysu.edu.tw for review and approval.

The final application deadline is October 31, 2026. Applications submitted after the deadline will not be accepted.

4. Project and Budget Review

A review panel will evaluate all submitted proposals and budget plans. The final funding amounts will be determined based on the review results.

5. Fund Disbursement and Reporting

Each participating university shall submit the relevant receipts to NSYSU for fund disbursement. All expenditures shall be claimed and reimbursed in accordance with applicable regulations of the Ministry of Education.

Each university shall complete its internal reimbursement procedures by December 31, 2026, and submit a final project report to NSYSU by January 31, 2027. Any unclaimed or unused funds must be returned in full to NSYSU, which will then return the funds and submit the required documentation to the Ministry of Education for final project settlement.

The required documentation for project closure will be announced separately.
