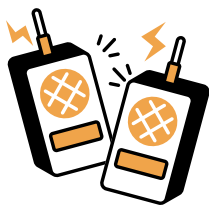
BEWARE OF FAKE WEBSITES AND APPS!

Some scammers create fake booking websites or apps that appear legitimate but are actually designed to steal your personal and payment information.

ATTRACTIVE DISCOUNTS AND DEALS?

BE CAREFUL!

Scammers often promote fake discounts on booking sites through social media or online forums, offering unbelievable deals like sudden price drops, upgrades, or free meals. Clicking the link may redirect you to a fake website that asks for credit card details, leading to fraud.



PAYMENT VERIFICATION ISSUES?

DON'T FALL FOR IT!

Scammers may impersonate customer service and send phone calls or messages claiming that there's an issue with your booking or verification, and ask you to update your credit card information or make a payment. Always contact the hotel directly and don't trust strangers!

AVOID PREPAYMENT AND PROTECT YOUR FINANCIAL INFORMATION!

Legitimate booking sites typically charge at check-in. Be cautious of requests for prepayment, and never share personal details such as credit card information or ID numbers with strangers.



LOOK FOR OFFICIAL

ACCOMMODATION CERTIFICATIONS

Scammers might create fake photos, reviews, and ratings to make low-quality accommodations seem popular. Always check for official accommodation certifications before booking to ensure a safe and enjoyable trip!

USE 'HOTEL SEARCH NETWORK' TO FIND LICENSED ACCOMMODATIONS

For legitimate Taiwan accommodations, always use the Ministry of Transportation and Communications' 'Hotel Search Network'. All certified hotels are listed here, ensuring safety and security!
